## **The Clinical Question:**

**FORM** THE PICO

- P patient
- I Intervention
- **C** Comparison
- O Outcome

**BE SPECIFIC** 

The more specific, the better return of relevant data.

UTILIZE LIBRARIANS

Librarians are an important resource for developing **PICOs and search** strategies

#### Lessons from RECOVER CPR auidelines:

### **OUTCOMES MUST BE SPECIFIC**

- Create multiple PICOs with different outcomes instead of lumping
- GRADE allows for less bias in evidence evaluation

Instead of having PICOs that cover a broad range of outcomes or comparison groups, make multiple PICOs that are highly specific.







- Despite a lack of veterinary evidence, highly specific PICOs will yield better, more relevant results
- More PICOs are better than fewer ones
- Evidential quality is not in reference to the study, but the study's relevance to the PICO
- Whether a large project or just individual investigation, EBVM is conducted in the same manner.
